As they say in Hawaii, "A Hui Hou!" Until we meet again!

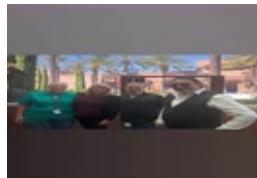

“ A Tribute to Jerry Breedlove

For nine incredible years, I had the privilege of working alongside Jerry Breedlove—not just as a manager, but as a mentor, a big brother, and a true inspiration. Our bond didn't end when our time in the workforce did; it continued for another five years, growing stronger beyond the office walls.

Jerry was the image of generosity and professionalism. He didn't simply lead—he uplifted, encouraged, and shared his wisdom with an open heart. He had a rare gift for making those around him feel truly valued, offering guidance not just as a colleague but as a friend. His leadership wasn't about authority, but about compassion, integrity, and unwavering support.

One memory stands out that perfectly captures his character. I once shared with Jerry my concerns about my oldest daughter, who was in first grade at the time. The school had discovered she had a lazy eye that required her to wear a patch on her stronger eye to train it. I told him how difficult this was for her, as children at school would make unpleasant comments. Jerry listened carefully, offering quiet understanding.

The next day, he called me into his office. To my surprise, he was wearing a patch over one of his eyes. He had taken a picture of us together, wearing the patch, and asked me to show it to my daughter—to reassure her that she wasn't alone, that others wore patches too, and that it was perfectly okay. That simple but profound act of kindness meant the world to me, and even more to my daughter. It was just another example of how Jerry's compassion extended beyond the workplace and touched lives in the most personal ways.

The impact Jerry had on my life is immeasurable. The lessons he taught me, the friendship we shared, and the kindness he showed will always remain with me. Though he is no longer with us, his

legacy endures in the lives he touched—including mine.

Rest in peace, Jerry. May God shower you with His mercy, my dear and true friend. All my family loves you Jerry, My wife, my daughters and my in-laws. You will always be remembered, admired, and deeply missed.
